В.	State purpose/thesis—what you want to convince the other members(about 10 seconds)
should be	approximately 2 minutes) Each claim you make (whether constructive or refuting the opposition) supported with sound reasons and/or statistics or facts, and quotations from experts or people affected sues. Be sure to state the importance, or <i>impact</i> that claim has for the overall topic of debate.
1.	Name the Claim: issue of debate
2.	Proof: evidence and reasoning to support the argument; explain how the proof relates to the claim
3.	Impact: why the argument is important/significant, especially to the particular side debated. Challenge the opposition to respond to an issue.
