3. Solution Presentation

Introduction

Once students have completed their research they will need to present it to the rest of the class. This activity provides students with a clear outline of how to propose their solutions and justify them through their research. The ideas presented are suggestions, be sure to allow students to explore alternative means of presenting their issue, solution and research.

Procedure

After students have completed their research, they can begin working on a way to present it to the class. Regardless of how the material is presented it will need to include the following.

- 1. Explanation of the issue
- 2. Examples of the issue having local impact
- 3. Description of the proposed solution and why it is relevant
- 4. How the solution will be executed (steps)
- 5. Who the solution will reach and help
- 6. Where the solution will have its greatest impact
- 7. Examples of similar success models (organizations and solutions)
- 8. A timeline for implementation
- 9. How success of the solution will be measured
- 10. What successful execution of the solution will achieve
